Remarks:

1. A total of 36 units are required for graduation: 15 units of Graduate Institute of European Studies required courses (including 6 credits for Thesis and Professional Practice Report Writing) + 21 unit of elective course. And graduates through the qualification test and the master's thesis.
2. In the 21 elective credits, after the student applies for approval, students can take 6 credits in other graduate institutes.
